As part of the participation, OBS and its buyers and consignors may contribute .05% (1/20th of 1 percent) of all sales. This comes out to \$50 for every \$100,000 in sales. RNA's will not be included in contribution calculations.

The OBS feed store located at the stable gate will be open for feed, hay and supplies for your convenience from 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM weekdays, 7:30 AM to 4:30 PM Saturday, and 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM on Sunday, March 6th.

<u>STALLS:</u> Do not use a stall or tack room without OBS approval. Stalls are assigned for sale horses only. Please cooperate with fellow consignors if tack rooms/stalls need to be shared. **Stall assignments will be available Wednesday, February 23rd. The barn area will be open beginning Saturday, February 26th.**

MEDICATION, RIDING CROPS, HORSESHOES, PROHIBITED PRACTICES: Please see attached policy

TESTING:

- 1) Post-breeze random testing will be performed on horses selected at the sole discretion of OBS. Blood will be drawn at the test barn (Barn 12A)
- 2) Buyers may request testing for exogenous anabolic steroids at the time of purchase and for undisclosed medication within 24 hours of purchase.
- 3) Test results will be submitted to the Department of Agriculture as required. The consignor is subject to penalties described in Florida Statute Chapter 535.08 including being charged with a misdemeanor and barred from selling for a period of 2 years.

MEDICATION REPORTING: All medication administered to a horse within 72 hours of an under tack show or beginning of a sales session must be reported the earlier of 12 hours after treatment or 1 hour **prior to an under tack show and/or sales session**. The reports must be signed by a Florida licensed veterinarian and submitted to the OBS main office or the repository. The reports must identify the medication and the amount, strength and mode of administration; the date and time of administration; and the diagnosis and/or reason for treatment. Medications may only be administered at or below manufacturers recommended dosages.

SUMMARY OF MEDICATION REGULATIONS (FLORIDA CHAPTER 535.08): No person shall administer to a thoroughbred horse offered at a licensed public sale any substance recognized as an injectable, oral, or topical medication within 72 hours of the start of the sales session (or under tack show) unless the person is a licensed veterinarian and the medication is therapeutic or necessary for the treatment or prevention of an illness or injury and is reported to the sales organization. A separate medication form signed by a veterinarian must be submitted individually for each horse treated. Copies of 535.08 are available at OBS.

REPOSITORY: THERE IS NO LONGER A BONE WARRANTY FOR ANY HORSE WHETHER OR NOT THERE ARE RADIOGRAPHS IN THE REPOSITORY. PLEASE REVIEW THE ENCLOSED RULES AND INFORMATION REGARDING THE REPOSITORY AND THE CHANGES TO THE OBS CONDITIONS OF SALE. The information may also be found on the OBS website

<u>PAPERWORK:</u> A \$100 late fee will be assessed after <u>FRIDAY, March 4th</u>. Please submit your paperwork, including authorized agent forms, as soon as possible and make necessary arrangements with your bank.

EHV-1 VACCINATION RECORDS: OBS requires the EHV-1 vaccination records form signed by a veterinarian to be submitted. All horses shipping from out of state MUST be accompanied by a negative coggins and a health certificate

EQUINE PIROPLASMOSIS TESTS: While an Equine Piroplasmosis test will **not** be required for the 2022 March sale, horses traveling from out of state should contact the Florida Department of Agriculture (850-410-0900) for any additional documentation needed to enter the state of Florida.

<u>UNDER TACK SHOW</u>: Horses must be presented as scheduled. Changes must be approved prior to the under tack show. Please keep your horse to the side and out of the way while waiting for your rider. A horse may only appear once during the under tack show.

Under Tack Forms must be submitted by noon, Friday, March 4th

RACETRACK SCHEDULE: Until February 27 the main and training track hours are 6:30 AM until 12:00 PM. Starting Monday, February 28, track hours will be 6:30 AM until 1:00 PM (both tracks) and the ¾ chute will be open. Beginning Wednesday March 2nd there will be a break on the main track starting at 9:00 AM a break on the training track starting at 9:30 AM Thursday thru Saturday, March 10th- 12th: the main track will be CLOSED for the Under Tack Show. The Training Track will be open 6:30 AM until noon with a break at 9:30 AM during the Under Tack Show.

TRACK AND UNDER TACK RULES: Please see attached notice.

SADDLE TOWELS/HIP TAGS/HALTERS: Be available at your barn two hours prior to the sale to assist our hip taggers. Do not remove SALE HALTERS or HIP TAGS. \$25 will be charged for halter tags or saddle towels not returned to the OBS Stable Gate.

<u>CARE OF HORSE AFTER SALE:</u> The consignor is responsible for the care of the horse until the buyer picks up the horse or for at least **48 hours** after the sale. Notify OBS after that time so that we may look after the horse.

SHAVINGS: ONLY BAGGED SHAVINGS ARE ALLOWED.

MUCK PICK - UP SCHEDULE: Muck wagons will be removed starting at 8:30 AM daily and returned at the end of the day.

SIGNS/STALL CARDS: Signs may not be hung in the shed row or by an entrance/exit of the barn. OBS will assist you in hanging signs from the barns. **OBS is not responsible for signs left after the sale**. Consignors are responsible for their own stall cards.

GATES: Please bring in your sales tack, feed, and equipment in early morning or after the sale. Trucks will not be allowed in the barn area after 9:00 AM each morning so consignors may show their horses

NO DOGS are allowed on the sale premises

Policy for Medication, Prohibited Practices, Riding Crops and Horseshoes

(Sections in red Updated March 2022)

Medication

All medication administered to a horse within 72 hours of an under tack show or beginning of a sales session must be reported the earlier of 12 hours after treatment or 1 hour prior to an under tack show and/or sales session. The reports must be signed by a Florida licensed veterinarian and submitted to the OBS main office or Repository. The reports must identify the medication and the amount, strength and mode of administration; the date and time of administration; and the diagnosis and/or reason for treatment. Medications may only be administered at or below manufacturers recommended dosages.

Controlled Therapeutic Medication Guidelines

The administration of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) must be in accordance with the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) schedule for controlled therapeutic medications (ARCI controlled therapeutic medications schedule for horses-version 4.1 (January 2019) subject to the additional restrictions listed below. PHENYLBUTAZONE (BUTE), FLUNIXIN (BANAMINE) AND KETOPROFEN (KETOFEN) ARE THE ONLY ALLOWABLE NSAIDS. ALL OTHER NSAIDS ARE NOT ALLOWED (Category 3 Penalty- subject to Fines & Suspension). No medication may be administered 24 hours prior to a horse's under tack show performance.

Additional restrictions/clarifications:

1) ONLY ONE (1) OF THE THREE ALLOWABLE NSAIDs (BUTE, BANAMINE, KETOFEN) MAY BE PRESENT IN A TEST SAMPLE--STACKING OF NSAIDs IS PROHIBITED. NO NSAID MAY BE ADMINISTERED 24 HOURS PRIOR TO A HORSE'S SALE SESSION. (Category 3 Penalty- subject to Fines & Suspension)

Summary of RCI recommended withdrawal times for administration of NSAIDs

Flunixin (Banamine) Suggested withdrawal: 32 hours

- Single intravenous dose of flunixin as Banamine (flunixin meglumine) at 1.1 milligram per kilogram
- 20 nanogram per milliliter of plasma or serum

Ketoprofen (Ketofen, Orudis)

- Suggested withdrawal: 24 hours
- Single intravenous dose of ketoprofen as Ketofen at 2.2 milligrams perkilogram
- 2 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum

Phenylbutazone (Bute) Suggested withdrawal: 24 hours

- Single intravenous dose of phenylbutazone at 4.0 milligrams per kilogram
- 2 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum
- 2) BRONCHODILATORS (Clenbuterol, Albuterol, and all other bronchodilators) ARE PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES and may NOT be present in a test sample. (Category 1 Penalty- subject to Return, Fines & Suspension)
- 3) No more than one (1) corticosteroid may be present in a test sample. NO CORTICOSTEROID MAY BE ADMINISTERED 24 HOURS PRIOR TO A HORSE'S SALE SESSION (Category 3 Penalty- subject to Fines & Suspension)

PLEASE NOTE:

- a) Many throat wash medications contain corticosteroids. Consult your veterinarian when creating a treatment plan.
- Depo Medrol remains in a horse's system longer than many other medications. A positive test may occur from treatments prior to arriving on the sales grounds.
- 4) Intra-articular injections are prohibited on the sales grounds. (Category 2 Penalty- subject to Return, Fines & Suspension)
- 5) The administration of anabolic androgenic steroids at any time to weanlings, yearlings, 2-year-olds and horses of racing age is prohibited and may NOT be present in a test sample. (Category 1 Penalty- subject to Return, Fines & Suspension)
- 6) The administration of bisphosphonates at any time to any horse under four years old is prohibited and may **NOT** be present in a test sample. (Category 1 Penalty- subject to Return, Fines & Suspension)
- 7) The following medications may **NOT** be administered on the sales grounds or present in a test sample (Category 1 Penalty- subject to Return, Fines & Suspension):
 - All substances classified as either Class 1 or Class 2 by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI).
 - b) Furosemide (Salix) (except for horses that have raced on Furosemide)
 - c) **Procaine Penicillin**
 - d) Medroxyprogesterone
 - e) **Antihistamines**
 - f) Guanabenz
 - Drugs or medications for which no acceptable threshold concentration has been established by the ARCI.

Please note: Fluphenazine (Prolixin), Reserpine (Serpasil), Carisoprodol (Soma, Rela) are class 2 medications. Many herbal supplements contain prohibited substances including bronchodilators and stimulants.

Please review these medication policies with your veterinarian to assure compliance.

Testing

- 1) Post-breeze testing will be performed on horses selected at the sole discretion of OBS.
- 2) Buyers may request testing for anabolic androgenic steroids, bisphosphonates and undisclosed medication within 24 hours of purchase and prior to the horse leaving the sales grounds.
- 3)Test results will be submitted to the Department of Agriculture as required. The consignor is subject to penalties described in Florida Statute Chapter 535.08 including being charged with a misdemeanor and barred from selling for a period of 2 years.

Prohibited Practices

Horses that have been subject to any of the following prohibited practices shall be subject to return or withdrawal:

- 1) Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy or Radial Pulse Wave Therapy while on the sales grounds
- 2) Acupuncture and/or Electro-Stimulation with the intent of altering laryngeal function while on the sales grounds
- 3) **Electrical devices** designed or used to increase the speed of a horse. Anyone in possession of a prohibited electrical device will be banned from the OBS sales grounds.
- 4) Any **invasive practice** while on the sales grounds which intentionally conceals a material defect or chronic lameness.
- 5) **Internal Blister or other injections** to the knee intended to have the effect of concealing the true conformation of the horse is not permitted at any time.

Use of a Riding Crop and Spurs at an Under Tack Show

Excessive use of a riding crop while on the track is prohibited. Prior to the starting pole which the horse begins to breeze (i.e. 1/8, 1/4, or 3/8), a rider may only remove their hands from the reins and strike the horse two times behind the girth. Additionally, the swing of the riding crop may not be above the rider's shoulder and the crop must remain in the "turned down" position. At any time after the starting pole which the horse begins to breeze, a rider may only use the riding crop while both hands are holding the reins and may not strike the horse behind the girth. In situations where the safety of the horse or rider is in jeopardy, a riding crop may be used in front of the girth. Spurs are not allowed. Any infraction of this policy may result in a fine up to \$1,000 per incident to be paid by the consignor. Chronic offenders may be banned from riding on the sales grounds. The sales company or its representatives have full, final and sole authority to interpret and enforce this rule. Funds collected from fines levied will be distributed to a thoroughbred industry related charity at the sole discretion of Ocala Breeders' Sales Company.

Horseshoes

A horse at a two-year-old in training sale may not train with front shoes that have toe grabs which exceed 2mm, or bends, turn-downs, stickers, jar caulks or any other traction device. Turn-downs of more than ¼" will not be permitted on hind shoes. For training on the Main track, OBS recommends the use of only flat Queen's Plate, Queen's Plate XT or equivalent.

Medication and Prohibited Practices Penalties

1. Category 1 & 2 - Subject to Return, Fines, & Suspension

- A. If a positive test result is received and a confirmation test is not requested or is confirmed by a laboratory selected by OBS for the administration of:
 - I. Any anabolic androgenic steroids
 - II. Undisclosed medication administered within 72 hours of sale or under tack show
 - III. An ARCI class 1 or 2 medication, Furosemide (Salix) (except for horses that have raced on Furosemide)
 - IV. procaine penicillin
 - V. Any bronchodilator
 - VI. Any bisphosphonate to any horse under four years old
 - VII. Medroxyprogesterone
 - VIII. Antihistamines
 - IX. Guanabenz
 - X. Drugs or medications for which no acceptable threshold concentration has been established by the ARCI.

The purchaser shall have the right to rescind the sale and the consignor shall refund any sales proceeds paid to consignor by OBS and pay the purchaser or OBS all proper expenses and legal fees incurred by either of them from the time of the sale until the return of the horse to the consignor or consignor's owner.

If the horse did not go through the auction ring, the horse shall be withdrawn from the sale and shall be removed from the sales grounds immediately. The consignor shall be responsible for OBS fees, penalties, and expenses.

If the horse went through the auction ring and was not sold, the horse shall be removed from the sales grounds immediately. The consignor shall be responsible for OBS fees, penalties, and expenses.

- B. Horses that have been subject to any of the following prohibited practices shall be subject to return or withdrawal and the consignor shall be responsible for expenses incurred by the purchaser and for OBS fees, penalties, and expenses:
 - I. Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy or Radial Pulse Wave Therapy while on the sales grounds
 - II. Acupuncture and/or Electro-Stimulation with the intent of altering laryngeal function while on the sales grounds
 - III. Electrical devices designed or used to increase the speed of a horse. Anyone in possession of a prohibited electrical device will be banned from the OBS sales grounds.
 - IV. Any invasive practice while on the sales grounds which intentionally conceals a material defect or chronic lameness
 - V. Internal Blister or other injections to the knee intended to have the effect of concealing the true conformation of the horse is not permitted at any time.
- C. In addition to the potential Return or Withdrawal of a horse, consignor will be subject to the penalties described in section three below.

2. Category 3 - Subject to Fines-Suspension

- A. The consignor will be subject to the penalties in section three (3) if a positive test result is received and a split sample test is not requested or is confirmed by a laboratory selected at the sole discretion of OBS which indicates the administration of:
 - I. Any medication within 24 hours of the horse's under tack show performance
 - II. More than one (1) corticosteroid
 - III. More than one (1) of the allowable (Bute, Banamine, Ketofen) non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs)
 - IV. Approved allowable Therapeutic Medications at levels above the threshold indicated in the ARCI controlled therapeutic medications schedule for horses-version 4.1 (January 2019)
 - V. Use of an NSAID other than Phenylbutazone (Bute), Flunixin (Banamine) or Ketoprofen (Ketofen)

3. Fines-Suspension for Category 1, 2, & 3

- A. The consignor will be subject to the following penalties for positive test results or prohibited practices:
 - I. 1st offense Warning with a maximum fine of \$2,000; possible increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense.
 - II. 2nd offense Warning with a maximum fine of \$3,000; increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense; possible suspension of consignor for up to 1 year to be determined by the OBS Board of Directors absent mitigating circumstances.
 - III. 3rd offense Fine of \$1,000 to \$5,000 absent mitigating circumstances; increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense; possible suspension of consignor for up to 2 years to be determined by the OBS Board of Directors absent mitigating circumstances.
 - IV. Any positive test for a medication or practice in Category 1 or 2_may result in additional fines and penalties and incur a suspension of not less than 2 years to be determined by the OBS Board of Directors, absent mitigating circumstances.
- B. Funds collected from fines levied will be distributed to a thoroughbred industry related charity at the sole discretion of OBS. Fines will be deducted from proceeds when available. Failure to pay fines may result in suspension from participating in OBS Sales.

The under tack show will start 8:00AM each morning.

Use of a Riding Crop and Spurs at an Under Tack Show

Excessive use of a riding crop while on the track is prohibited. Prior to the starting pole which the horse begins to breeze (i.e. 1/8, 1/4, or 3/8), a rider may only remove their hands from the reins and strike the horse two times behind the girth. Additionally, the swing of the riding crop may not be above the rider's shoulder and the crop must remain in the "turned down" position. At any time after the starting pole which the horse begins to breeze, a rider may only use the riding crop while both hands are holding the reins and may not strike the horse behind the girth. In situations where the safety of the horse or rider is in jeopardy, a riding crop may be used in front of the girth. Spurs are not allowed. Any infraction of this policy may result in a fine up to \$1,000 per incident to be paid by the consignor. Chronic offenders may be banned from riding on the sales grounds. The sales company or its representatives have full, final and sole authority to interpret and enforce this rule. Funds collected from fines levied will be distributed to a thoroughbred industry related charity at the sole discretion of Ocala Breeders' Sales Company.

SAFETY VESTS AND HELMETS: OBS requires <u>ALL</u> riders to wear an approved safety vest and helmet while on horseback. This applies to anyone aboard any horse (ponies included). Safety vests must be zipped and helmet straps fastened at all times including to and from the racetrack and in the shed row.

TRACK RULES

- 1. Do not jog horses on the horse path.
- 2. Stay off the rail unless you are breezing.
- 3. OBS saddle towels should be on sale horses by Tuesday, March 1st.

TRACK HOURS: Until February 27 the main and training track hours are 6:30 AM until 12:00 PM. Starting Monday, February 28, track hours will be 6:30 AM until 1:00 PM (both tracks) and the ¾ chute will be open. Beginning Wednesday March 2nd there will be a break on the main track starting at 9:00 AM a break on the training track starting at 9:30 AM Thursday thru Saturday, March 10th- 12th: the main track will be CLOSED for the Under Tack Show. The Training Track will be open 6:30 AM until noon with a break at 9:30 AM during the Under Tack Show.

<u>MEDICATION REPORTS:</u> Must be submitted the earlier of 12 hours after treatment or 1 hour prior to the start of the under tack show or sale session. (*MEDICATION REPORTS FOR ALL HORSES MUST BE SUBMITTED BEFORE THE UNDER TACK SHOW STARTS*).

WASH RACKS/PENS: Wash racks are not allowed on the sales grounds in order to allow ample room for consignors to show their horses and help the overall look of the grounds.

<u>WORK & GO</u>: Work & Go horses will not be allowed during under tack shows. Sunday, March 6th will be the last day for Work & Go's until After the March Sale.

ATTENTION CONSIGNORS:

All horses must be off the grounds by **Friday**, **March 18**th. Please make arrangements to ship your horses. **Please notify us if you have April Sale horses**.

 be supplied via a flash drive or electronically through Drop Box or We Transfer.

- GRAPHICS: OBS has created graphic packages for you to add to your video with the proper identifying information. This will
 help create a more standardized look for all of the videos. You may access these graphic templates are on the website under
 Consignor Information.
- PERSONAL VIDEOS: We urge you to use a professional videographer to best present your horse, but If you choose to create a
 walking videos yourself please follow these recommendations;
 - Be sure to hold your camera/smart phone in landscape (sideways) orientation.
 - Have your camera settings adjusted to 1920 x 1080 and 30 frames per second.
 - Please familiarize yourself with the Tips for shooting horse videos below
 - Please be sure to adhere to file size requirements listed above.
 - If you do not have the capability to add graphics to your video, you may use audio to properly identify each horse.

Photos

- Photos should be a conformation shot with no added graphics and saved as a .jpg THIS IS THE ONLY FILE COMPATIBLE FORMAT. They may be supplied via a flash drive or electronically through Drop Box or We Transfer.
- NAMING OF FILES (**VERY IMPORTANT**): photos should be named with the hip number followed by the letter "p" ONLY. **DO NOT PUT ANY OTHER INFORMATION** (**DAM, SIRE, ETC.**) **IN THE NAME OF THE FILE**. For example, if the photo is of hip number 54, the file should be named, "54p.jpg"
- FILE SIZE: photos should be no larger than 1250 x 1000 pixels and the file should not exceed 2mb Once the files are delivered to OBS, please allow up to 48 hours for them to be available on the website. We will post them online as quickly as possible. Please be sure files are labeled correctly. We receive thousands of individual media files and proper file labels will speed up the process immensely. If you have any questions you may contact Wes Peterson in the OBS office. OBS reserves the right to not accept any videos we feel does not represent the horse well.

Tips for shooting horse videos

- Photographer should keep the sun to their back and avoid harsh shadows on horses
- Shooting on a slightly cloudy day is fine and usually prevents shadows. Do not shoot if it is raining.
- The ideal shooting location should allow 40 or more feet for the horse to walk in a straight line. The area should be flat with a pleasing background that is free of distractions.
- When shooting with a cell phone maintain a distance of about 20 feet from the horse. This will ensure the entire horse is included in the frame.
- Walking on a hard surface shows the entire feet. If horse is walking on grass please make sure it is freshly cut. If walking on mulch or other material make sure it has been raked.
- If your phone or camera records in a format other than the required .mp4 file type it will need to be converted. The easiest way is to upload your video to Youtube. When the video finishes processing just click the download button. The file will be sent back to you as an .mp4.

 - a. Radiographs may be submitted on an external hard drive, USB drive, CD or DVD.
 - b. One hip per CD/DVD
 - c. ALL IMAGES PER HIP MUST BE IN A SINGLE DICOM FOLDER
- Please label the studies in the following manner;
 - a. Patient -- Hip Number as it is in the catalogue (horses' names are not required) When inputting the hip number be sure to use four digits i.e. 0001 for Hip 1.
 - b. Owner -- Consignor as listed in catalog
 - c. Accession Number Day the horse sells and hip number i.e. Day 1-0001
- We recommend a recent version of Internet Explorer as the best browser on a PC (or Mac running Bootcamp/Windows) and using the "DICOM Images" option for diagnostic quality images.
- The "JPEG Images" option works well over slower connections however it is not recommended for a final diagnosis as
 the quality is not high enough. To get the best out of the JPEG mode please install Microsoft Silverlight so you can
 rotate and zoom images.
- An Internet connection with a download speed of 1.5mbit/s or higher is recommended to view the DICOM Images.
- Keystone Community (the software that uploads radiographs) detects installations of Merge eFilm, Sound VetPACS,
 IDEXX EquiView and Asteris Discovery when it starts. It acts as a DICOM server and can communicate via that method
 with many compatible PACS systems or simply drag and drop DCM/DICOM formatted files at step 2 of the
 software. You can drag an entire folder or individual files for one complete study.
- Please disable "burned-in" image labeling (annotations) if your DR system supports it.
- Hanging Protocols -- Our system is hanging protocol aware and can be customized depending on how effectively the horse can be identified during uploading of the study. If you want the viewing vet to be able to adjust the hanging protocol used, we recommend you upload your study and match any images which can't be automatically identified. Uploading your own studies online allows the submitting vet full control over the process and more accuracy as the automatic options do not always match perfectly. If you have a Digital Radiograph machine that is new to market or recently updated please encourage your machine vendor to contact Asteris so they can work with the vendor to automate the hanging protocol detection system in their software. It is advisable to submit a sample set of radiographs before a sale to help eliminate potential problems.
