- **Under tack forms for the last three days of the under tack show (Thurs – Sat) must be submitted by 10 AM Saturday, April 4.**

MEDICATION POLICY — PLEASE READ. VERY IMPORTANT

PLEASE BE SURE TO READ THE NEW MEDICATION POLICIES IN THIS DOCUMENT. THIS MEDICATION POLICY APPLIES TO ALL OBS SALES. Please note that buyers have the option to request blood tests for prohibited medications, undisclosed medications AND MEDICATIONS GIVEN WITHIN NEW ADMINISTRATION TIMES at the time of purchase. Administration of ANY medications within 72 hours of a horse's sale session must be reported on a medication form and signed by your veterinarian.

Those forms are available in the front office and the Repository.

ALL MEDICATION VIOLATIONS WILL BE RETURNABLE.

THE REPORTING OF MEDICATION IS FOR YOUR PROTECTION.

NO STRAW BEDDING ALLOWED—BAGGED SHAVINGS ONLY.

BULK / LOOSE SHAVINGS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN BARN 1 – 20. BULK SHAVINGS WILL BE ALLOWED IN BARN A – J BUT MAY ONLY BE UNLOADED IN THE SHAVINGS BINS ON THE END OF EACH BARN.

SHAVINGS TRUCKS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AFTER FRIDAY, APRIL 3.

New for 2026

Pre-Under Tack Show Exams

- All horses are required to be physically examined (including heart auscultation) by their attending veterinarian prior to participating in an under tack show. Veterinarians must submit a statement that they have examined the horses under their care and they are suitable for participation in the under tack show.
- Attending veterinarians' examinations must include a jog-up exam on each horse.
- Examinations must be performed no earlier than 72 hours prior to a horse's scheduled Under Tack day. Examinations must be turned in by 4 pm two days prior to a horse's scheduled Under Tack day. This allows for two working days to perform the exams. See schedule below:

- The statement must be signed by the attending veterinarian and submitted to OBS by the veterinarian either through the OBS Veterinarian portal or via the examination form provided by OBS.
- Horses deemed not suitable to participate in an Under Tack show or without veterinarian statements will not be allowed to participate in an Under Tack show.
- If a horse suffers an unforeseen temporary issue and cannot perform on their scheduled day, OBS will work to accommodate those horses on a later day in the Under Tack show. Those horses will require a letter from the attending veterinarian with an explanation of the issue requiring extra time and a statement prior to the horse breezing affirming their suitability to perform in the Under Tack show.

Under Tack Forms

- Horses listed on the Under Tack form that do not go through the sales ring will be assessed a \$500 fee. Veterinary certificates will not be accepted.

Riding Crop Rule

- A rider is prohibited, except in the case of horse or rider safety, from removing their hands from the reins to strike a horse at any time at an Under Tack Show (before, during and after the breeze).
- All riding crops must not exceed 30 inches in length.
- Penalties for violations of the new rule are as follows:
 - 1st offense: \$1,000 charged to consignor
 - 2nd offense: \$2,000 charged to consignor
 - 3rd offense: \$2,000 and rider suspension from one or more Under Tack shows

Walking Videos

Sellers may provide OBS walking videos of horses in their consignment which we will include on the sortable master index in the OBS website. OBS reserves the right to reject any video based on quality and its ability to enhance a horse's marketability.

Equine Piroplasmosis Testing

While an Equine Piroplasmosis test will not be required for the 2026 April sale, consignors may consider performing a C Elisa test for Piroplasmosis on all sale horses. This test is required for South Korean quarantine. A list of horses negative for this test will be given to the South Korean buyers. Additionally, please list any other vaccinations, such as **Eastern Western Encephalomyelitis**, as this may assist International buyers with the quarantine process

- Assignment of digital Jockey Club Certificate
- Coggins (dated within 6 months of date of sale)
- EVA Test (dated within 90 days of date of sale)
- EHV-1 vaccination record (dated between 14 and 90 days from sale)
- Vaccination Records for **EEE/WEE/WNV**
- Vaccination Records for **Rabies & Tetanus**
- Authorized Agent Forms

REMINDER!

Carefully review the catalog page for accuracy, especially state-bred and stakes engagements. You, the consignor, are responsible and any errors could result in the return of the horse. Notify Jordin Rosser of any corrections as soon as possible.

The OBS feed store located at the stable gate will be open for feed, hay and supplies for your convenience from 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM weekdays, 7:30 AM to 4:30 PM Saturday, and 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM on Sunday, April 5th and April 12th.

Please be available at your barn two hours prior to the sale to provide assistance to our hip taggers and expedite the process. Please be reminded that if the buyer does not pick up the horse or make arrangements for its care, the consignor should insure the horse will be cared for. If you can no longer care for the horse, notify OBS so we may look after the horse. Do not remove the sales halter or hip tags from the horse and return halter tags and saddle towels to the stable gate.

STRAW BEDDING WILL NOT BE ALLOWED—BAGGED SHAVINGS ONLY.

STALLS: Do not use a stall or tack room without OBS approval. Stalls are assigned for sale horses only. Please cooperate with fellow consignors if tack rooms/stalls need to be shared.

Pre-Under Tack Show Exams

- All horses are required to be physically examined by their attending veterinarian prior to participating in an Under Tack Show. Veterinarians must submit a statement that they have examined the horses under their care and they are suitable for participation in the Under Tack Show.
- Attending veterinarians' examinations must include a jog-up exam on each horse.
- Examinations must be performed no earlier than 72 hours prior to a horse's scheduled Under Tack day. Examinations must be turned in by 4 pm two days prior to a horse's scheduled Under Tack day. This allows for two working days to perform the exams. See schedule below:

- The statement must be signed by the Attending Veterinarian and submitted to OBS.
- Horses deemed not suitable to participate in an Under Tack show or without veterinarian statements will not be allowed to participate in an Under Tack show.
- If a horse suffers an unforeseen temporary issue and cannot perform on their scheduled day, OBS will work to accommodate those horses on a later day in the Under Tack show. Those horses will require a letter from the attending veterinarian with an explanation of the issue requiring extra time and a statement prior to the horse breezing affirming their suitability to perform in the Under Tack show.

MEDICATION, RIDING CROPS, HORSESHOES, AND PROHIBITED PRACTICES: SEE ATTACHED POLICY.

PAPERWORK: A \$100 late fee will be assessed after FRIDAY, April 3rd. Please submit your paperwork, including authorized agent forms, as soon as possible and make necessary arrangements with your bank.

Under Tack: Horses must be presented as scheduled. Changes must be approved prior to the under tack show. A horse may only appear once during the under tack show. **HORSES LISTED ON THE UNDER TACK FORM THAT DO NOT GO THROUGH THE SALES RING WILL BE ASSESSED A \$500 FEE. VETERINARY CERTIFICATES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

RACETRACK SCHEDULE: 3/27 – 4/5: Both Tracks open until 1 pm. The ¾ chute open beginning 3/31 the Main track will break at 9 AM, training track will break at 9:30 AM

TRACK AND UNDER TACK RULES: Please see attached notice.

SADDLE TOWELS/HIP TAGS/HALTERS: Be available at your barn two hours prior to the sale to assist our hip taggers. Do not remove SALE HALTERS or HIP TAGS. \$100 will be charged for halter tags or saddle towels not returned to the OBS Stable Gate.

CARE OF HORSE AFTER SALE: The consignor is responsible for the care of the horse until the buyer picks up the horse or for at least 48 hours after the sale. Notify OBS after that time so that we may look after the horse.

MUCK PICK - UP SCHEDULE: Muck wagons will be removed starting at 8:30 AM daily and returned at the end of the day.

SIGNS/STALL CARDS: Signs may not be hung in the shed row or by an entrance/exit of the barn. OBS will assist you in hanging signs from the barns. OBS is not responsible for signs left after the sale. Consignors are responsible for their own stall cards.

GATES: Please bring in your sales tack, feed, and equipment in early morning or after the sale. Trucks will not be allowed in the barn area after 9:00 AM each morning so consignors may show their horses

Policy for Medication, Prohibited Practices, Riding Crops and Horseshoes
(Sections In Red Updated July 2024)

OBS, in conjunction with Keeneland and Fasig Tipton have adopted the following Medication Policies and Prohibited Practices effective July 2024. These rules will apply to auctions held on the OBS sales grounds.

Additionally, **Florida State Statute 535.08** requires all medication administered to a horse within 72 hours of an under tack show or beginning of a sales session must be reported the earlier of 12 hours after treatment or 1 hour prior to an under tack show and/or sales session. The reports must be signed by a Florida licensed veterinarian and submitted to the OBS main office or Repository. The reports must identify the medication and the amount, strength and mode of administration; the date and time of administration; and the diagnosis and/or reason for treatment. Medications may only be administered at or below manufacturers recommended dosages.

The OBS Medication Policy is in addition to the rights of the Buyer, Owner or the Consignor as set forth in the Florida Statutes, Title XXXIII, Chapter 535.01-535.14 and is not intended to replace or otherwise affect Florida law.

Controlled Therapeutic Medication Guidelines

Under Tack Show Medication Policies

- **NO NSAIDS OR CORTICOSTEROIDS MAY BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 48 HOURS OF A HORSE'S UNDER TACK PERFORMANCE.**
- **NO OTHER MEDICATION MAY BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 24 HOURS OF A HORSE'S UNDER TACK PERFORMANCE.**

Sales Session Medication Policies

- **NO CORTICOSTEROIDS MAY BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 24 HOURS OF A HORSE'S SALES SESSION.**
- **NO NSAIDS MAY BE ADMINISTERED AFTER 6:00 PM THE DAY PRIOR TO A HORSE'S SALES SESSION.**

NEW Penalties for all Medication Violations

- **ALL MEDICATION VIOLATIONS INCLUDING ALLOWABLE THERAPEUTIC MEDICATIONS ABOVE THRESHOLD LIMITS (OVERAGES), UNDISCLOSED MEDICATIONS, PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES AND PROHIBITED PRACTICES WILL BE SUBJECT TO WITHDRAWAL OR RETURN.**
- **PLEASE NOTE: WITH THE NEW RESTRICTED ADMINISTRATION TIMES, MULTI DAY ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATIONS AND/OR ORAL ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATIONS PRIOR TO RESTRICTED ADMINISTRATION TIMES INCREASES THE RISK OF A POSITIVE TEST.**

Additional Restrictions/Clarifications:

1. NSAIDS

- A. Phenylbutazone, Flunixin and Ketoprofen are the only allowable NSAIDS. Only one (1) of these may be present in test sample; stacking of NSAIDS is prohibited. IMPORTANT NOTE: **DMSO IS CONSIDERED AN NSAID AND NOT ONE OF THE THREE ALLOWABLE NSAIDS.****

- B. NEW Restricted Administration Times:**

- i. **No NSAIDS may be administered within 48 hours of a horse's under tack performance.**
- ii. **No NSAIDS may be administered after 6:00 PM the day prior to a horse's sales session.**

LIMITED EXCEPTION: A second NSAID may be used only to accommodate an emergency health or medical need of a horse, but only if the second NSAID is disclosed and documented by a licensed veterinarian stating the type of NSAID, dosage given, date and time of administration and an explanation of the medical need for the use. The veterinarian statement must be submitted to OBS the earlier of 12 hours after treatment or 1 hour prior to an under tack show and/or sales session. In the event a disclosure statement is filed within two (2) hours and/or 100 hips of the horse selling, OBS may, in its sole discretion, require the administration to be announced from the auction stand.

2. Corticosteroids

- A. NEW Restricted Administration Times:**

- i. **No Corticosteroids may be administered within 48 hours of a horse's under tack performance.**
- ii. **No Corticosteroids may be administered within 24 hours of a horse's sales session.**
- iii. No more than one (1) corticosteroid may be present in a test sample. PLEASE NOTE:

- a. Many throat wash medications contain corticosteroids. Consult your veterinarian when creating a treatment plan.
- b. Depo Medrol and Betamethasone remain in a horse's system longer than many other medications. A positive test may occur from treatments prior to arriving on the sales grounds.

Additional Restrictions/Clarifications Continued

3. The following medications are PROHIBITED and may NOT be administered on the sales grounds or present in a test sample:

- All substances classified as either Class 1 or Class 2 by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI).
- Anabolic Androgenic Steroids
- Bronchodilators (Clenbuterol, Albuterol, and all other bronchodilators) Exception: **The administration of a bronchodilator (including without limitation Clenbuterol) for valid, on-label use prior to July 1 of a horse's yearling year is permitted but must be disclosed in the Repository with a note of explanation from the treating veterinarian.**
- Bisphosphonates
- Procaine Penicillin
- Furosemide (Salix) (except for horses that have raced on Furosemide)
- Medroxyprogesterone
- Antihistamines (2yo's only)
- Guanabenz
- Drugs or medications for which no acceptable threshold concentration has been established
- **Any substances banned by HISA. IMPORTANT NOTE: ISOXSUPRINE, ALTRENOGEST (IN MALE HORSES) AND THYRO-L ARE ON THE HISA PROHIBITED LIST**

PLEASE NOTE:

- For positive findings in which the identified substance is a substance of human use or abuse, the determination of whether the positive test constitutes a violation of the conditions of sale shall be made by OBS in its sole discretion following any investigation it deems fit.
- Fluphenazine (Prolixin), Reserpine (Serpasil), Carisoprodol (Soma, Rela) are class 2 medications. Many herbal supplements contain prohibited substances including bronchodilators and stimulants. Please review these medication policies with your veterinarian to assure compliance.

Testing

- Testing during Under Tack Shows will be on horses selected at the sole discretion of OBS.
- Buyers may request two different tests at the time of purchase by checking the appropriate box on the Buyers' Acknowledgment:
 1. A medication screening which includes prohibited substances, undisclosed medications **AND THERAPEUTIC MEDICATIONS ADMINISTERED WITHIN THE RESTRICTED ADMINISTRATION TIMES.**
 2. A test for Bisphosphonates.
- Test samples will be submitted to a testing facility determined solely by OBS. **A POSITIVE TEST WILL RESULT IN A HORSE BEING SUBJECT TO WITHDRAWAL OR RETURN.**
- In the event of a Positive Test the consignor may be subject to additional penalties, including those described in Florida Statute Chapter 535.08 which includes being charged with a misdemeanor and barred from selling for a period of 2 years.

Prohibited Practices

Horses that have been subject to any of the following prohibited practices shall be subject to return or withdrawal:

- 1) **Extracorporeal Shock Wave Therapy or Radial Pulse Wave Therapy** while on the sales grounds.
- 2) **Acupuncture and/or Electro-Stimulation** with the intent of altering laryngeal function while on the sales grounds.
- 3) **Electrical devices** designed or used to increase the speed of a horse. Anyone in possession of a prohibited electrical device will be banned from the OBS sales.
- 4) Any **invasive practice** which intentionally conceals a material defect or chronic lameness.
- 5) **Internal Blister or other injections** to the knee intended to have the effect of concealing the true conformation of the horse.
- 6) Intra-articular injections are PROHIBITED on the sales grounds **AND/OR WITHIN 14 DAYS OF THE SALE**.

Medication and Prohibited Practices - Subject to Return, Fines, & Suspension

If a positive test result is received and /or is confirmed by a laboratory selected by OBS for the administration of:

- a) Prohibited Substances (see above)
- b) Prohibited Practices (see above)
- c) Undisclosed medication administered within 72 hours of sale session or under tack show
- d) **Therapeutic Medications above their testing thresholds which indicate the medication was given after their Restricted Administration Time.**

The purchaser shall have the right to rescind the sale and the consignor shall refund any sales proceeds paid to consignor by OBS and pay the purchaser or OBS all proper expenses and legal fees incurred by either of them from the time of the sale until the return of the horse to the consignor or consignor's owner.

If the horse has not gone through the auction ring, the horse may be withdrawn from the sale and removed from the sales grounds immediately. The consignor shall be responsible for OBS fees, penalties, and expenses.

If the horse went through the auction ring and was not sold, the horse may be removed from the sales grounds immediately. The consignor shall be responsible for OBS fees, penalties, and expenses.

In addition to the potential Return or Withdrawal of a horse, consignor will be subject to the penalties described in the section below.

Fines-Suspension Schedule

- a. The consignor will be subject to the following penalties for positive test results or prohibited practices:
 - i. 1st offense - Warning or a maximum fine of **\$2,000**; possible increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense.
 - ii. 2nd offense - Warning or a maximum fine of **\$3,000**; increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense; possible suspension of consignor for up to 1 year to be determined by the OBS Board of Directors.
 - iii. 3rd offense - Fine of **\$1,000 to \$5,000** absent mitigating circumstances; increased testing of consignors' horses at consignor expense; possible suspension of consignor from participating in OBS Sales, to be determined by the OBS Board of Directors.
- b. Funds collected from fines levied will be distributed to a thoroughbred industry related charitable organization at the sole discretion of OBS. Fines are due and payable at time of assessment. If not paid, fines will be deducted from proceeds when available. Failure to pay fines may result in suspension from participating in OBS Sales.

Use of a Riding Crop and Spurs at an Under Tack Show-NEW FOR 2026

Excessive use of a riding crop while on the track is prohibited. **DURING THE UNDER TACK SHOW A RIDER IS PROHIBITED, EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF HORSE OR RIDER SAFETY, FROM REMOVING THEIR HANDS FROM THE REINS TO STRIKE A HORSE AT ANY TIME (BEFORE, DURING AND AFTER THE BREEZE).** All riding crops must not exceed 30 inches in length. Penalties for violations of the new rule are as follows: 1st offense \$1,000 charged to consignor, 2nd offense: \$2,000 charged to consignor and 3rd offense: \$2,000 and rider suspension from one or more Under Tack shows. The sales company or its representatives have full, final and sole authority to interpret and enforce this rule. Funds collected from fines levied will be distributed to a thoroughbred industry related charity at the sole discretion of Ocala Breeders' Sales Company.

SAFETY VESTS AND HELMETS

OBS requires **ALL** riders to wear an approved safety vest and helmet while on horseback. This applies to anyone aboard any horse (ponies included). Safety vests must be zipped and helmet straps fastened at all times including to and from the racetrack and in the shed row.

TRACK RULES

1. Do not jog horses on the horse path.
2. Stay off the rail unless you are breezing.
3. OBS saddle towels should be used by Monday, March 30.

TRACK HOURS

3/27 – 4/5 Both Tracks open until 1 pm the $\frac{3}{4}$ chute will be open. Beginning 3/31 the Main track will break at 9 AM, training track will break at 9:30 AM No non-sale work and go's until after the April Sale.

MEDICATION REPORTS

PROTOCOL FOR PRE-SALE VIDEOENDOSCOPIC EXAMINATION OF THE UPPER AIRWAY AT PUBLIC AUCTION

- Equipment must be capable of producing a digital video image of excellent quality.
- Horse must be identified appropriately, and that identification must be in digital format with character generation on the screen, and / or video of the catalog page, followed by unbroken video of the face prior to introduction of the scope into the nares (right or left) and up to the larynx. This is a single stream video with no editing.
- The veterinarian performing the video endoscopy may upload the video at the same time radiographs are uploaded to the OBS repository. Veterinarians or the consignor may also submit each upper airway video on an individual flash drive or CD. Upper airway videos should be stored in a file separate from the radiographs.
- Standard technique must include maximal abduction of arytenoids induced by swallowing (multiple times) and nasal occlusion. The duration of the video must be sufficient to identify all laryngeal and pharyngeal structures as well as observing their maximal function within the context of a resting exam.
- The interval between the pre-sale videoendoscopic exam and the selling session will not exceed (10) days.

Walking Video and Conformation Photo Guidelines

Consignors will be able to provide walking videos of all of their horses to be displayed on the OBS Sortable Master Index.

Consignors will be responsible for procuring their own videographers to produce and supply videos. Consignors should keep in mind the following:

Videos

- Walking videos should be delivered to OBS as .mp4 file formats. THIS IS THE ONLY FILE FORMAT WE WILL ACCEPT. They may be supplied via a flash drive or electronically through Drop Box or We Transfer.
- NAMING OF FILES (**VERY IMPORTANT**): walking videos should be named with the hip number followed by the letter "w". **DO NOT PUT ANY OTHER INFORMATION (DAM, SIRE, ETC.) IN THE NAME OF THE FILE.** For example, if the video is of hip number 54, the file should be named, "54w.mp4"
- FILE SIZE: walking videos should be 45-60 seconds in length. File size should not exceed 20 mb
- SHOT SEQUENCE: For walking videos, we recommend the following shot sequence
 1. Conformation shot
 2. Walking left to right
 3. Walking right to left
 4. Walking away
 5. Walking toward
 6. Conformation shot
- GRAPHICS: OBS has created graphic packages for you to add to your video with the proper identifying information. This will help create a more standardized look for all of the videos. You may access these graphic templates on the website under Consignor Information.
- PERSONAL VIDEOS: We urge you to use a professional videographer to best present your horse, but if you choose to create a walking video yourself please follow these recommendations;
 - Be sure to hold your camera/smart phone in landscape (sideways) orientation.
 - Have your camera settings adjusted to 1920 x 1080 and 30 frames per second.
 - Please familiarize yourself with the **Tips for shooting horse videos** below
 - Please be sure to adhere to file size requirements listed above.
 - If you do not have the capability to add graphics to your video, you may use audio to properly identify each horse.

Photos

- Photos should be a conformation shot with no added graphics and saved as a .jpg THIS IS THE ONLY FILE COMPATIBLE FORMAT. They may be supplied via a flash drive or electronically through Drop Box or We Transfer.
- NAMING OF FILES (**VERY IMPORTANT**): photos should be named with the hip number followed by the letter "p" ONLY. **DO NOT PUT ANY OTHER INFORMATION (DAM, SIRE, ETC.) IN THE NAME OF THE FILE.** For example, if the photo is of hip number 54, the file should be named, "54p.jpg"
- FILE SIZE: photos should be no larger than 1250 x 1000 pixels and the file should not exceed 2mb
Once the files are delivered to OBS, please allow up to 48 hours for them to be available on the website. We will post them online as quickly as possible. Please be sure files are labeled correctly. We receive thousands of individual media files and proper file labels will speed up the process immensely. If you have any questions you may contact Wes Peterson in the OBS office. OBS reserves the right to not accept any videos we feel does not represent the horse well.

Tips for shooting horse videos

- Photographer should keep the sun to their back and avoid harsh shadows on horses
- Shooting on a slightly cloudy day is fine and usually prevents shadows. Do not shoot if it is raining.
- The ideal shooting location should allow 40 or more feet for the horse to walk in a straight line. The area should be flat with a pleasing background that is free of distractions.
- When shooting with a cell phone maintain a distance of about 20 feet from the horse. This will ensure the entire horse is included in the frame.
- Walking on a hard surface shows the entire feet. If horse is walking on grass please make sure it is freshly cut. If walking on mulch or other material make sure it has been raked.
- If your phone or camera records in a format other than the required .mp4 file type it will need to be converted. The easiest way is to upload your video to Youtube. When the video finishes processing just click the download button. The file will be sent back to you as an .mp4.
